Hello Grace Lutheran faith family,

God made everything good, so it feels unfair to play favorites, but certainly the upcoming seasons of Advent and Christmas are a special time of year!

I was chatting with my youngest recently and I asked her how she felt when the Christmas tree was all set up and presents started gathering under the tree. She responded that she starts to get excited! When I dug in deeper, she didn't express any frustration about how hard it is to wait, she just reflected on how fun it was to watch it all unfold, knowing that Christmas was coming.

This made me think about how important the season of Advent is to fully appreciate Christmas. The world around us wants to thrust us into Christmas earlier each year. I think Hallmark ornament displays start to pop up in July! Certainly, before October is over, I see red and green displays popping up around the corner from Halloween candy. Don't get me started on Christmas music...my kids think I'm a ridiculous scrooge because I just cannot listen to Christmas tunes before Thanksgiving!

So, I want to encourage everyone to slow down. We have 4 Sundays in Advent to help prepare our hearts and souls for the coming of the Christ child. We have a special gift that is coming and needn't be rushed. Just as Mary waited 9 months, so we are invited to the depth created during the waiting. The waiting, the nurturing our hearts, the growing the depth of our spirit, the practice of generosity to others, the dwelling in scripture...prepares us for the moment the world begins to change through Jesus Christ. It allows for our soul, like Mary's, to magnify the Lord (Luke 1:46).

Advent slows us down so that all of the sweetness of Christmas can be appreciated. For, even the present of the Christ child doesn't compare to the gift of salvation we experience in the future cross and empty tomb. Advent invites us into reflection that amidst the strife and turmoil we might experience in our earthly life, we know the hope gifted to us by God through Jesus Christ in our baptism.

Jesus' presence into the world changes everything, and our presence to Jesus changes everything, too.

I pray for each of us to continue to be transformed by Jesus' presence found in the body of Christ in the assembled faithful at worship, in the word made flesh in scripture, and the body and blood share in the sacrament of communion. Part II of lesser known health and spiritual resources related to Aging in Place starts with an interesting and specific to need resource: Five Wishes.

Now Is the Time to Plan

Though we don't like to think about it, a change in health or an accident can happen to any of us. That's why it's important for all of us, regardless of age or health, to make important decisions before a health crisis and have a plan that documents our wishes in case we become unable to make important treatment decisions or communicate our choices. This will give you the assurance that your wishes have been voiced and documented, as well as provide your loved ones with the peace of mind that they are honoring your wishes. If you don't designate the person you want to make your health care decisions, someone else will be chosen for you who may not know your wishes.

We know talking about advance care planning and end-of-life care is difficult. It's hard to know what to say or where to start.



A valuable resource to help start, guide and document this discussion is *Five Wishes*. More people have used Five Wishes for their living will or advance directive than any other document because it is presented in easy to understand language to help you express your wishes in the areas that matter most – the personal, emotional and spiritual, as well as the medical and legal. Five Wishes serves as a resource to guide you through planning before a health crisis, as well as a means to legally document a health care surrogate, choices for medical treatment, comfort and care wishes, as well as what you want your loved ones to know.

If you are interested in learning more about Five Wishes and advance care and end-of-life care planning, we'd love to help answer your questions and be a resource for you. 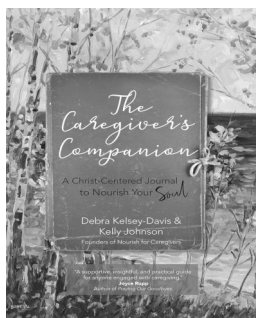
Your congregation and faith community come together to guide, support, and care for one another. Five Wishes is a gentle approach to end of life concerns that fits with any denomination.

Amazing Grays were also informed of resource nurse services available by local Sanford Clinic. Grace Lutheran's own Claire Johnson shared a list of these specifics as follows:

- ♦ Care Coordination with transitioning into assisted living or nursing home
- ♦ Helping line up home caregiver-coordination with the county social workers for needs assessments
- ♦ Working individually with those who have chronic conditions such as: diabetes, obesity, hypertension, multiple diagnoses. We set goals and communicated with providers on how the individual is doing
- ♦ Coordinating with specially providers when that is pertinent
- ♦ Calling patients following hospitalization to ensure they have what they need at discharge and are clear on discharge instructions
- ♦ Outpatient wound care services available

Another amazing nurse, that Grace Lutheran Church can be so proud of, is parishioner Karis Gust who kindly shares a Sanford Health News podcast titled:

“Karis Gust: Probably 80% of the residents that I talk to who are currently in assisted living, when they move in, they say, boy, I should have done this a long time ago. And that's OK. It's sometimes hard to hear because, you know, maybe they could have stayed in assisted living longer, or maybe they could have, I guess, I don't know what it could have been.

But they realize the benefits of being in assisted living. They're getting more support. They're having opportunities to socialize with other people. And that's something that they realize once they get there that had been severely lacking in their lives.

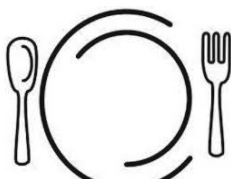

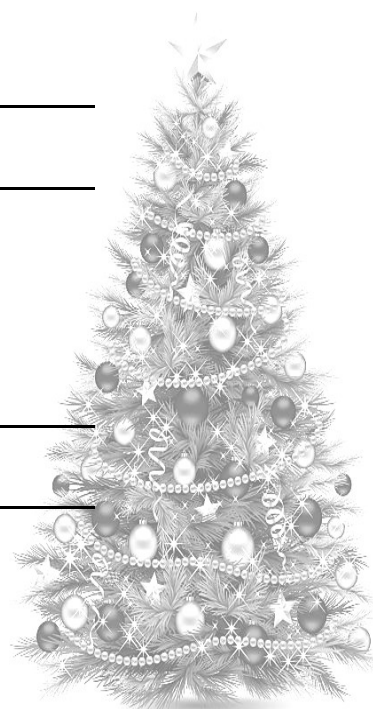
