Hello Grace Lutheran faith family!



I've been thinking a lot about what kind of qualities show up when a church is healthy. If you do a quick google search, there are a lot of suggestions. The one that I am thinking about most today is how reducing "us vs them" thinking is a sign of health and serves as an orienteering point to pursue when trying to get healthier. When a church, or organization, has a "we" mentality, we lean in more deeply to the abundant life promised through Jesus Christ.

























Humanity really loves black and white mentality, so it takes work to stand in the middle and welcome both sides and to try to hold multiple perspectives at the same time. "Us vs. them" mentality is omni-present in our world. If we align with one political party, then there is often finger pointing towards the absurdity or evil of the other party. It is similar with sports teams, as noted in any variety of rivalries. But sometimes it shows up in smaller ways. I hear about competition, or "perceived" competition, between churches or frustration when ministry groups don't do something we hope they would. We can observe "us vs. them" perspectives in negative comments towards lower socio-economic classes, racial discrimination, agism and misunderstanding between generations, and more. Really, the list could go on forever.



The quote that inspires me today is not from the Bible, though I'll share one from the letter to the Hebrews at the end. It is from Theodore Roosevelt, 26<sup>th</sup> president of the United States, during a speech in Paris in 1910. It goes like this:

"It is not the critic who counts: not the man who points out how the strong man stumbles or where the doer of deeds could have done better. The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena, whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood, who strives valiantly, who errs and comes up short again and again, because there is no effort without error or shortcoming, but who knows the great enthusiasms, the great devotions, who spends himself in a worthy cause; who, at the best, knows, in the end, the triumph of high achievement, and who, at the worst, if he fails, at least he fails while daring greatly, so that his place shall never be with those cold and timid souls who knew neither victory nor defeat."

Inspiring quote, no doubt! We are called into God's call in our lives, as individuals, as ministry groups, as families, as a church, and in the collective of humanity. We are all called to be in the arena.

And here's where the "we" mentality comes into play. Let's show up in the arena – all the places God calls us to be. Let's engage with enthusiasm, devotion, sweat, and dedication! And...when we are not in the arena, let us not be the critics, let's be a cloud of witnesses showing up to support and cheer, bring water and snacks, pray and thank. Think about it today, how do we and can we show up in great health for those working hard for God's kingdom?

There are exciting things happening in church. Some new energy for Children, Youth, and Family, continued life within the Ministry in Action quilters, updated uses and appearances within the building, curiosity about supporting growing numbers at worship, a new health cabinet group forming, etc. It's exciting and there are some folks who are in the "arena" are working hard to make all of these ministries happen. I want to encourage all of us to make sure that we set aside expectations and opinions that might limit our ability to encourage our siblings in faith. Root for each other as we seek to grow in our ability to Love God, and Love Others.

Hear from Paul in the letter to the Hebrews (Chapter 12, verses 1-2):

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

Praise our Creator God, from whom all blessing flow. Praise to Jesus Christ who became human and invites us to follow him. Praise the Holy Spirit, our comforter and encourager, who helps guide us into greater life and love.

The other change you will see is the formation of a heritage room on second floor. The history of Grace is long, interesting, and important. ### **UPDATES from the Grace Lutheran Executive Ministry**

### Invite. Welcome. Connect.

At the annual All-Ministries Retreat in May, Congregational President Lucas Peters announced these three words as our guiding goals as we continue in our theme of "Inspired by Grace" for another year. Our hope is that all of the ministry we do in the months ahead can be focused on inviting people (members and guests alike) to our church, intentionally making sure all feel welcome when they join us, and connecting them to other people, to ministry opportunities, and, especially, to God. These are big goals, but we can all work together to grow in our faith, grow in our ministry, and grow as a church by thinking about and planning how we can invite, welcome, and connect ourselves and others!

### Transition from radio broadcasts to online live streaming

In June, KQAD radio informed us that, due to staff reductions at the radio station, our Sunday worship services will no longer be aired on the radio.

While we know the radio broadcast will be missed by some, we are fortunate that we already have a well-developed and well used livestream option. Each Sunday, our worship services are streamed live both on the Grace Facebook and YouTube pages. The services can be watched from anywhere and at any time. All worship services for the last four years are archived on our YouTube page.

For many years, members and friends of Grace have supported the radio broadcasts in honor or memory of a loved one, anniversaries, birthdays, and other special occasions. **We will continue to provide this meaningful sponsorship opportunity for our weekly livestreams.** The cost will continue to be \$90 at this time. We will now have the option to sponsor the livestream of special services such as Christmas Eve, Lent, and Holy Week services as well. Please contact Tylene in the church office if you are interested in supporting this important ministry.

### Space utilization and enhancements

We have spent the last few months considering how best to use the spaces we have at Grace. We have looked at how spaces are being used now and what opportunities there are to use our spaces better or differently. We considered the needs of various groups and activities, efficiency for setting up, take down, and cleaning, and began to dream of new and better uses for current and new programs.

While this is still a work in progress, we have identified the Fellowship Hall and Fireside Room as the first areas for needed enhancements. We will be selecting and purchasing new round tables and chairs for the Fellowship Hall and new meeting room tables and chairs for the Fireside Room. We will also purchase some new banquet-style tables that will be used for quilting and other uses throughout the church. All of the new tables and chairs will be modern and easier to move, yet sturdier and safer. The new furniture will help us be inviting and welcoming and to better connect with one another!

The cost of the new furniture will be between current funds already available in the building funds and gifts given to a special appeal that you will be hearing more about soon. Please prayerfully consider now how you might give a gift over and above your regular giving to support the purchase of the new furniture that will enhance our ministry for many years to come!



# CHILDREN, YOUTH AND FAMILY MINISTRIES UPDATE

In June, a task force, including Youth and Music Coordinator Erika Bierman and Pastor Sarah, met three times to review our current ministry programming for children and youth from birth to 12th grade. Online feedback from the congregation was also accepted.

The task force findings include:

- Erika's workload and efforts with music and worship responsibilities have increased since she was hired.
   Music and worship is now 15-20 hours per week and 20-25 hours per week for Children, Youth, and Family (CYF) ministries.
- Our number of children younger than Sunday School age (birth to 3 years old) is our largest current area of growth. More ministry for families this age is desired.
- Preschool and Elementary age Sunday School is going well overall, including Sunday School and additional programs for kids and families planned by Erika.
- Wednesday after-school Faithweavers has had a difficult time finding volunteers.
- Confirmation programming is ready for a re-start. After changes due to the pandemic and transitions of
  pastors and youth staff, consistency of curriculum and scheduling is needed. This is an exciting opportunity
  to create a new vision for Confirmation!
- High School youth is another area where growth and renewal is a goal. There are a good number of students and chaperones attending the National Youth Gathering this month, but an overall revisioning of our ministry for high school students is desired. This is another exciting opportunity to enhance our youth ministry!
- The staff time needed to fully prepare and lead programming for our over 160 children and youth at Grace is more than the 20-25 hours per week Erika currently has available. Additional staff time is needed to meet our overall goals and needs.

The task force presented these findings, including a request for the hiring of a part-time (10 hours per week) High School Youth Ministry Leader to the Executive Ministry. This request was approved (see job posting below).

The task force will continue to meet in July to vision and plan for new programming this fall. We are truly excited about the opportunities that are ahead!

# **Help Wanted: High School Youth Ministry Leader**

Grace Lutheran Church (ELCA) of Luverne is hiring a part-time (10 hours per week) High School Youth Ministry leader. This person (or persons) will work with the pastor, other staff, parents, and volunteers to vision, plan, and lead the overall programming for students in grades 9-12 and their families.

This position will primarily work Wednesday evenings, with some Sundays and other days as needed. This position will have some flexibility for schedules and duties based on the interests and skills of the person hired and needs of the congregation.






